



Welcome to the Manitoba Stick Curling Association's Men's & Women's Provincials

PRE-GAME PRACTICE

- Each curler from both teams will be allowed to deliver 2 practice rocks from their assigned end of the ice prior to starting each game throughout the event
- For all games, Last shot first end (LSFE/Hammer) and choice of color will be determined by a coin flip prior to the practice

Following your 1st GAME

- Each curler from both teams will throw one draw to the button, which will be measured by a member of the Adjudication Committee and potentially used in the tie breaking process. Details of the measuring process are included in your registration package

EXTRA ENDS

- All extra ends will be played from the scoreboard end of the ice back towards the glass or home end of the ice
- The rocks shall be moved to the far end in a timely fashion with no pause for on-ice communication between players
- The curler assigned to the home end of the ice at the start of the game will deliver the first 3 stones in the extra end – curlers then switch ends for the remaining 3 stones

RULES

- All rules approved by the Canadian Stick Curling Association apply and are posted
- There will normally be no officials on the ice and we encourage all teams to try to resolve any issues that may arise, immediately on the ice – otherwise notify the MSCA Adjudication Committee
- All members of the Adjudication Committee will have MSCA name tags and an Adjudication Committee name plate
- If a team lodges a complaint regarding a rule infraction, an Adjudicator will come out to the ice surface for the remainder of the game and watch all players on the sheet. If a violation occurs at this point the adjudicator will remove the offending rock
- All Adjudication Committee decisions are final and any abuse of officials will result in immediate expulsion from the event
- We encourage all teams to maintain an appropriate pace of play to complete all 6-end games within 60 minutes. Time outs should not exceed 90 seconds including travel time
- Any object placed between the hog lines (e.g. extra rocks, placards,..) shall be considered an extension of the side boards. A moving rock that contacts any of these objects will be deemed out of play at the point of contact
- Hit/take out weight shall not be less than eight (8) seconds hog-to-hog
